## The Imperfect Tense

**English Grammar Connection:** There are ways other than the simple past tense (*I studied*) to say that something happened. You can also say *I used to study* or *I was studying*. In Spanish, these ideas are expressed by the **imperfect tense**.

The **imperfect** is another past tense in Spanish. How do you see it?

## Here's how:

The **imperfect** is used to describe something that was not perfected or not completed in the past. You use it to...

- Talk about something that was happening
- Talk about something you used to do
- Say how old someone was
- Tell what time it was

Regular verbs in the **imperfect** take these ending:



Él **estaba** aquí cuando yo **hacía** el pastel. He **was** here when I **was making** the cake.

Only three verbs are irregular in the **imperfect.** 

Cuando yo **era** niño (a), **ibamos** a la playa. When I **was little**, we **used to go** to the beach.
